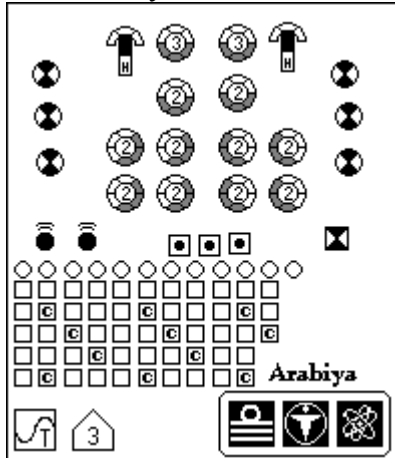


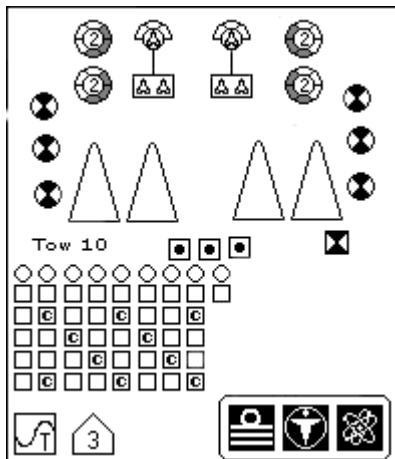
SDN Arabiya TMF 208 NPV 692



(able to tow 10 mass)

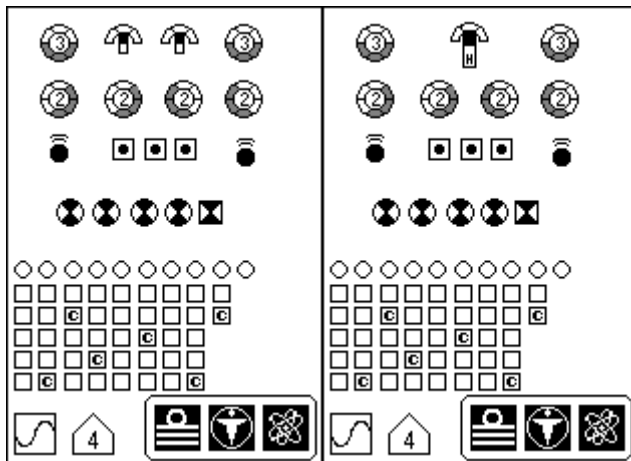
Notes: The Arabiyah was designed after the Madinah, but despite this (or because of it) has proven quicker to produce. FTL-tow capacity is typically used to carry scouts and weasel boats. Other ships in this class include *Misr*, *Pakistan*, *Arabiya Jadid* and *Suriyah*--the latter two replace a screen generator with extra Thrust capacity. Another alternative is to have the two Long Range PTorp exchanged with 4 PTorp

CVA Madinah TMF 184 NPV 623 + fighters



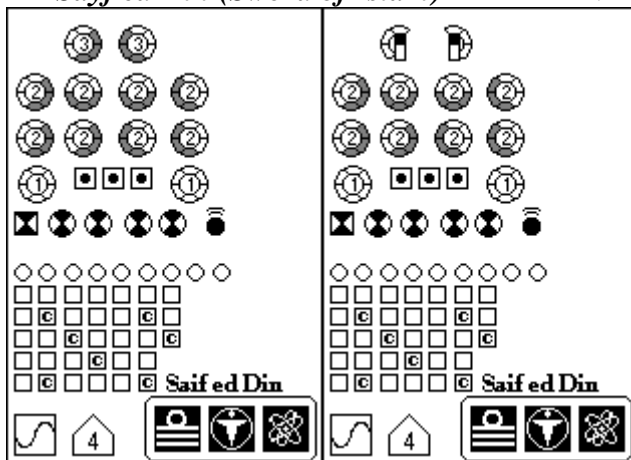
Notes: Other ships in this class are *Makkah*, *Riyadh Jadid*.

BDN *Battledreadnought* TMF 154 NPV 502



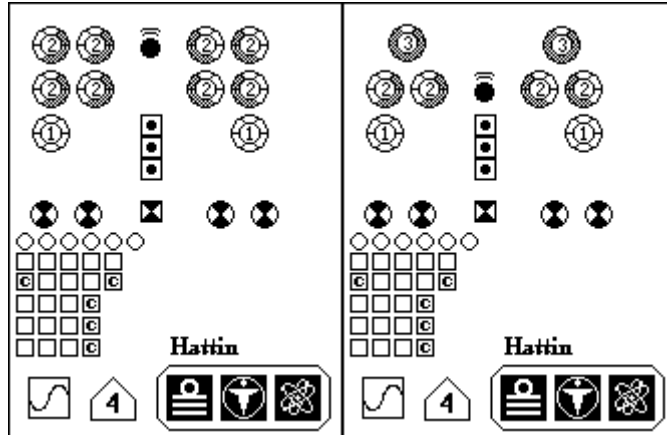
The BDN exist in two variants one with a Heavy PlasmaTorp and another type with two ordinary PlasmaTorp.

BB *Sayf ed Din (Sword of Islam)* TMF 124 NPV 406



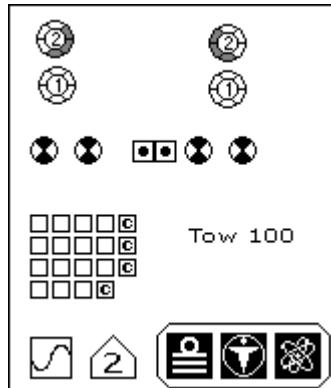
Notes: The Sayf ed Din was hastily designed and funded in response to continuing Pan African naval expansion, and specifically the newly purchased Rostovs. One variant under discussion eliminates the SMRs in favor of a cluster of submunitions, or a pair of pulse torpedoes. Ship names include *Asad ed Din*, *Nasr ed Din* and others. Another alternative is to have the two Class 3 batteries exchanged for four Class 2 batteries

CH Hattin TMF 84 NPV 277



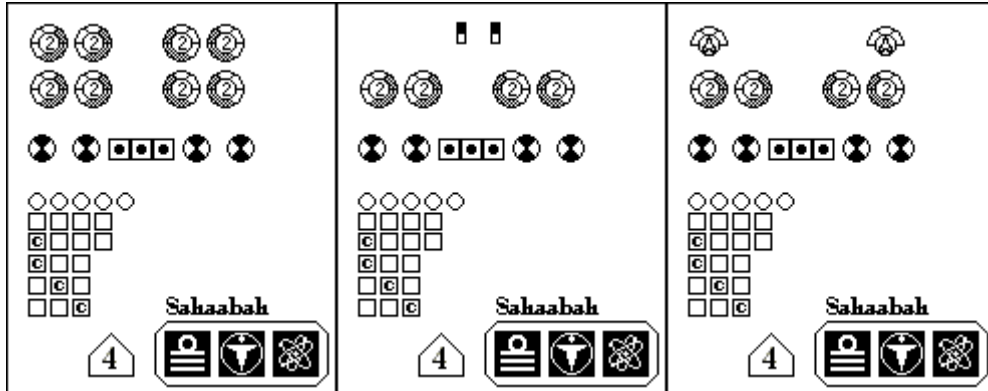
Notes: The workhorse of the Islamic Federation and the amirate fleets, the Hattin is the type most often seen outside IF space. The Admiralty has a high risk tolerance where a Hattin is concerned, feeling that it probably can escape if needed, and if not, at least the loss will be merely a cruiser, not a capital ship. This makes the class a favored assignment for glory-hunters, and ambitious officers regard a tour on a Hattin as a prerequisite for higher command. The class is named for Muslim battlefield victories and includes *Khartoum*, *Manzikert*, *Ain Jalut*, *Mansura*, *Mohacs* and others.

CP Slave TMF 63 NPV 203



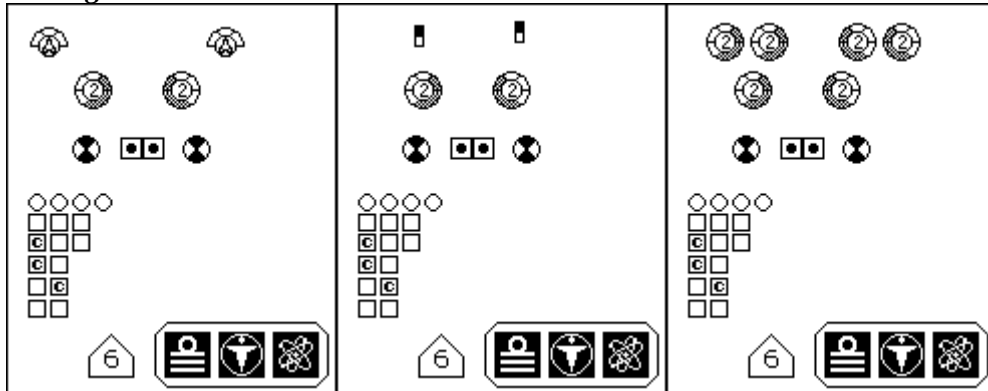
Note : since the Islamic federation doesn't trust all their captains they are not willing to Build smaller vessels with FLT drive the Slave class is designed for transporting a strike force to another system and deliver the blow the weapon arsenal is not intended for attack more for defence while deploying the rest of the force.

CP Sahaabah TMF 64 NPV 210



Notes: Based on an expanded Salah-ed-Din hull, the Sahaabah was added to the gap between that class and the Hattin heavy cruiser. Missile and beam-armed versions are equally popular; an escort variant replaces both weapon modules with an ADFC and six point defense systems. The ships are named for the Companions of the Prophet, and include *Abu-d Dardaa*, *Abu Ayyub al-Ansari*, *Abu Ubaydah ibn al-Jarrah*, *Adiyy ibn Hatim*, *Barakah*, *Fayruz ad-Daylami*, *Jafar ibn Abi Talib*, *Julaybib*, *Musab ibn Umayr*, *Said ibn Zayd*, *Suhayb ar-Rumi*, *Thabit ibn Qays* and others.

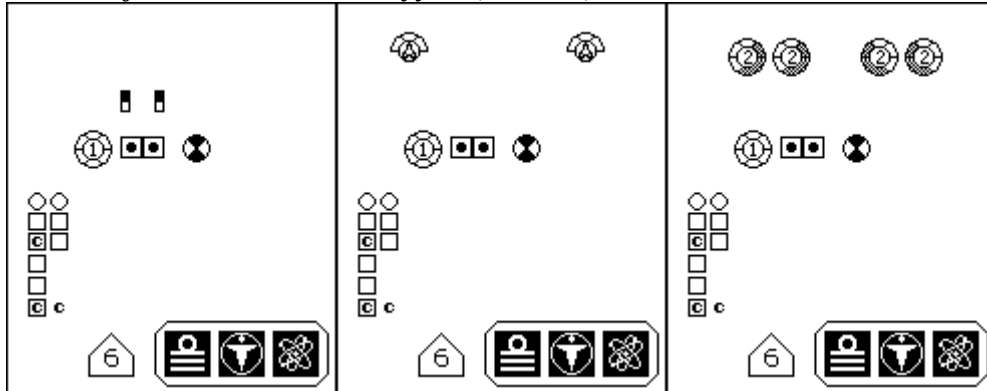
CL Light Cruiser TMF 54 NPV 175

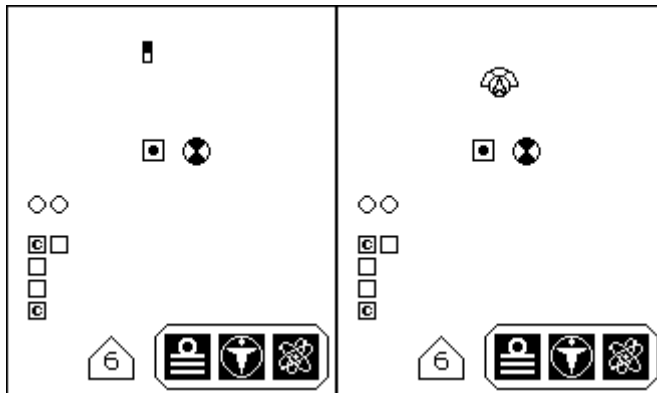
TMF 34 NPV 113



Notes: This class must be considered one of the more successful IF designs, in terms of numbers produced. This class includes *Imad ed Din Zenghi*, *Shirkuh*, *Nur ed Din*, *Qutuz*, *Mahmud the Great*, *Alp Arslan*, *Suleiman* and others named for Muslim conquerors.

TMF 44 NPV 81

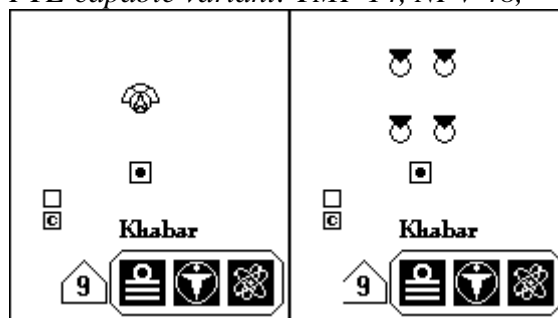


Notes: Jon does not remember what this class is named for. There is a newspaper named al Hawar, but that seems insufficiently martial. An escort variant would replace the SMR with 1 ADFC and 2 PDS.

Corvette Khabar

TMF 12 NPV 42 without *FTL*

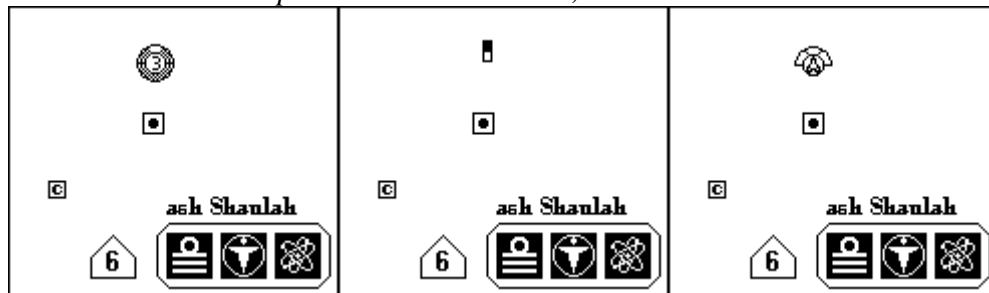
FTL-capable variant: TMF 14, NPV 48,



Notes: the Khabar is in essence an ash Shaulah with upgraded drives. The FLT capable ship is very uncommon but is used in Hit and run attacks.

Sting ship *ash Shaulah* TMF 8 NPV 30 without *FTL*

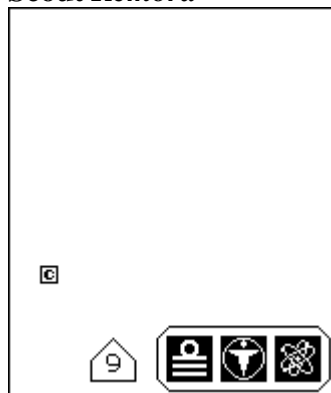
FTL-capable variant: TMF 10, NPV 36



Note: The ash Shaulah design was inspired by the FSE *Requin* strike boat, and squadrons of ash Shaulah stingboats now form the standard Islamic Federation outer system patrol. Prototypes were armed with submunition packs; however, simulations determined that these would have difficulty surviving long enough to get within striking range. Most production vessels are fitted with missile racks, carrying heavy missiles when these are available. Variants replace the racks with a single arc Beam-3, or in a few instances, a pair of needle beams. Service aboard an ash Shaulah is popular, as these craft have more living space per crewman than most IF ships (a legacy of the craft's FSE origin); however, crew morale is notably higher on those craft armed with longer-ranged weapons.

Scout *Remora*

Note: Remoras are often used as in-system couriers, scouts, weasels (substituting weasel systems for sensors), and missile-bait. Note: suggested miniature is a shortened ESU *Lenov*.
